As requested by Councillor Carmen Corbasson, please feel free to provide the Mayor and Council with a copy of Bruce Carr's letter dated March 10, 2010 that highlights our shared efforts to remediate Lakeview's waterfront properties.

Council's upcoming discussion on this issue is very timely as we approach the second anniversary of our government's July 16, 2008 announcement that "Lakeview's future in electricity generation is over".

That was a momentous day for our city and I'd like to recognize not only the tremendous support of council's unanimous position to prohibit power generation on our precious lakefront, but also the importance of a strong community vision to revitalize the Lakeview Village.

I understand that council may soon be deliberating the city's tertiary review of future land use for the area.
